


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MISSION

Since coming into our care, Chris has grown tremendously. He is now able to use full sentences and can carry on a conversation. Recently, he expressed his love for Jamaican food, and is now eager to join his Host Home Provider Family on a vacation to Jamaica.

Our mission at Creative Community Services is to work alongside our children, youth, and adults, meeting them where they are developmentally to give them the individualized tools and resources that empower them to grow at a pace that suits them. With the assistance of a caring team and loving family, we are excited to continue to see Chris grow over the coming years.

With much hard work and determination, we served 41 adults with developmental disabilities! We are grateful for our 47 host home families that are a major contribution to improving the lives of our individuals; we do this through providing individualized care for each adult in our program to help improve their social and life skills, pushing them to become their best selves.

Companionship is nurtured through proper placement with a Host Home Provider and by fostering positive family connections. CCS believes in improving lives through both positive community and family connections. Through socialization and companionship, we find that our individuals achieve a happier and more fulfilling life.

We regularly take our individuals to social outings to help build these life skills for their continued growth and practice vital social skills while giving them a relaxing day to enjoy life as anyone should be able to. These outings vary from trips to the aquarium, zoo, putt-putt golf, and more!





The needs of children with behavioral challenges and/ or developmental disabilities simply cannot be met effectively by traditional foster parenting. Unfortunately, the children we serve typically have lived through 15 to 30 unsuccessful foster placements by the time they come into our care. CCS families work with our highly trained teams of psychologists, social workers, family consultants, and therapists, along with DFCS (Department of Family and Children Services) case managers and birth families, to ensure these special children finally achieve permanency. Our goal is to provide therapeutic foster care when traditional care has not been the most effective. Our commitment is to provide a safe, nurturing home environment with a strength-based, solution-focused approach to care. In total, CCS worked with 51 therapeutic foster homes in 2023.

This year we have continued to serve 100+ youth from ages 6 weeks to 21 years old through placement services in TFC at CCS.

The majority of our youth are 13 years of age and and up. This creates even greater need for collaborating and partnering with our SOAR Program staff to work on building and developing real life knowledge and skills for independent living success when they age out of care.



ENHANCED HOMES

In an enhanced home, the foster parent goes to live with the foster youth, rather than the other way around. A foster parent is selected and matched with the child based on their experience and their ability to move into an already-furnished apartment, and they are reimbursed for rent, utilities, groceries, and care for the child.



KINSHIP CARE

A therapeutic kinship care refers to the care of children by relatives or friends — also known as fictive kin.

(Supporting Families, Overcoming Obstacles, Achieving Independence, Reaching New Heights)

SOAR strives to decrease the most challenging behaviors that our children present and improve their quality of life and placement stability. After observing them in their environment and talking with their caregivers, the SOAR team creates an individualized plan of intervention that will support and increase positive behavioral growth. We visit each child and family up to three times a week for up to three hours per visit to model interventions for the caregivers, while measuring improvement.

We also work with schools and day programs to ensure consistency in all environments and intervene with the families to increase their knowledge, education, and intervention strategies so they feel supported and more competent to manage behaviors.

SOAR has continued to serve our youth and adults with the best level of care and dedication. SOAR served 101 youth and 46 adults and helped provide the intensive services needed to obtain the resources necessary to successfully thrive in society, such as:





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RESPITE

For the 2023 calendar year, CCS served 46 children who utilized a grand total of 1,196 respite days. Planned respite helps to encourage placement stability and strong connections between foster youth and their families by providing foster parents with a break for at least two weekends per month.

During this break, the child stays in a certified therapeutic foster home.



ANNUAL CCS SPRING PICNIC

The annual CCS picnic celebrates our foster youth, adults with developmental disabilities, and their families. The day is filled with games, art projects, karaoke, and delicious food. This event helps to build our children, youth, and adult's social skills, while giving the staff a chance to connect with those we serve.







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CCS ANNUAL HOLIDAY PARTY

In December, we held our annual CCS Christmas Party. Families bonded, and our Cool Santa was a huge hit! The children and adults we serve connected over face painting, decorating cookies, and decorating the Christmas tree with ornaments they made themselves. They also picked out presents to give their caregivers at our Secret Santa Gift Shop, so they can join in the joy of gift giving, too.












FINANCIAL OVERVIEW


